Who we're looking for: We're looking for a Family Literacy Specialist to join our team, for a term, with the possibility of extension, to support family literacy advancement in Saskatchewan and family literacy collaborations across the country. This position will work with the team to research and design or redesign family literacy resources, training, and ongoing support methods for family literacy practitioners in Saskatchewan, and may include facilitating family literacy practitioner training and workshops as well as supporting family literacy awareness through communication strategies, including social media.

The ideal candidate will have a strong background in family literacy, including multi-generational family literacy and family literacy that honours cultural and linguistic diversity, neurodiversity, and the diversities of peoples within communities across our province. Ensuring Indigenous ways of knowing are well reflected is essential. Incorporating clear language and inclusive design principles that support adult and family learning is key.

Job Title: Family Literacy Specialist

Position Type: Term Position. Up to 1.0 FTE (Full-time Equivalent) – part-time work will be considered. This position may be on contract for the right candidate.

Term Length: 6 months, with the possibility of extension or transition to filling a maternity leave.

Work Location: Flexible. You may work either from our Saskatoon office or remotely from any location within the province. The SLN will cover the costs of any trips we require you to make, from within Saskatchewan to the Saskatoon office. Contact us if you are a Saskatchewan resident temporarily located outside of the province.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conduct research on family literacy best practices and emerging trends.
- Design/Redesign and develop family literacy resources and training, ensuring resources are culturally sensitive and inclusive, reflecting Indigenous ways of knowing, and sensitive to cultural and linguistic diversity as well as neurodiversity.
- Plan and deliver family literacy practitioner training sessions and workshops.
- As needed, provide ongoing support for family literacy practitioners.
- Collaborate with internal and external stakeholders on family literacy initiatives.
- Develop and implement communication strategies to raise awareness of family literacy.

- Strong cultural competence, and familiarity with Indigenous ways of knowing.
- Understanding of neurodiversity and the ability to tailor programs accordingly.
- Strong communication skills.
- Proficiency in using social media platforms for engagement and outreach.
- Strong familiarity with online platforms for communications, meetings, or delivering training.
- Ability to work collaboratively within a team and with external partners.
- Flexible and open to adapting strategies based on evolving needs and feedback.
- Ability to manage multiple tasks and deadlines effectively.
- Genuine passion for advancing family literacy and supporting diverse communities.
- Commitment to promoting inclusive and equitable learning opportunities.
- Experience working with Indigenous communities and knowledge of Indigenous languages.
- Familiarity with Saskatchewan's literacy landscape and community networks.
