The ideal candidate will have a strong background in online education and related platforms. This person will also have knowledge and/or experience in adult learning and instructional design principles as they relate to online learning, with a focus on clear language and inclusive design for increased accessibility.

Job Title: Online Learning Specialist

Position Type: Term Position. Up to 1.0 FTE (Full-time Equivalent) – part-time work will be considered. This position may be on contract for the right candidate.

Term Length: 6 months.

Work Location: Flexible. You may work either from our Saskatoon office or remotely from any location within the province. The SLN will cover the costs of any trips we require you to make, from within Saskatchewan to the Saskatoon office. - Building on evaluation and feedback collected, conduct any further needs assessments to understand the requirements and objectives of literacy practitioners in an online learning context.
- Collaborate with the team to develop and/or enhance practitioner journey maps through content, utilizing effective communication strategies, including direct mailing and social media.
