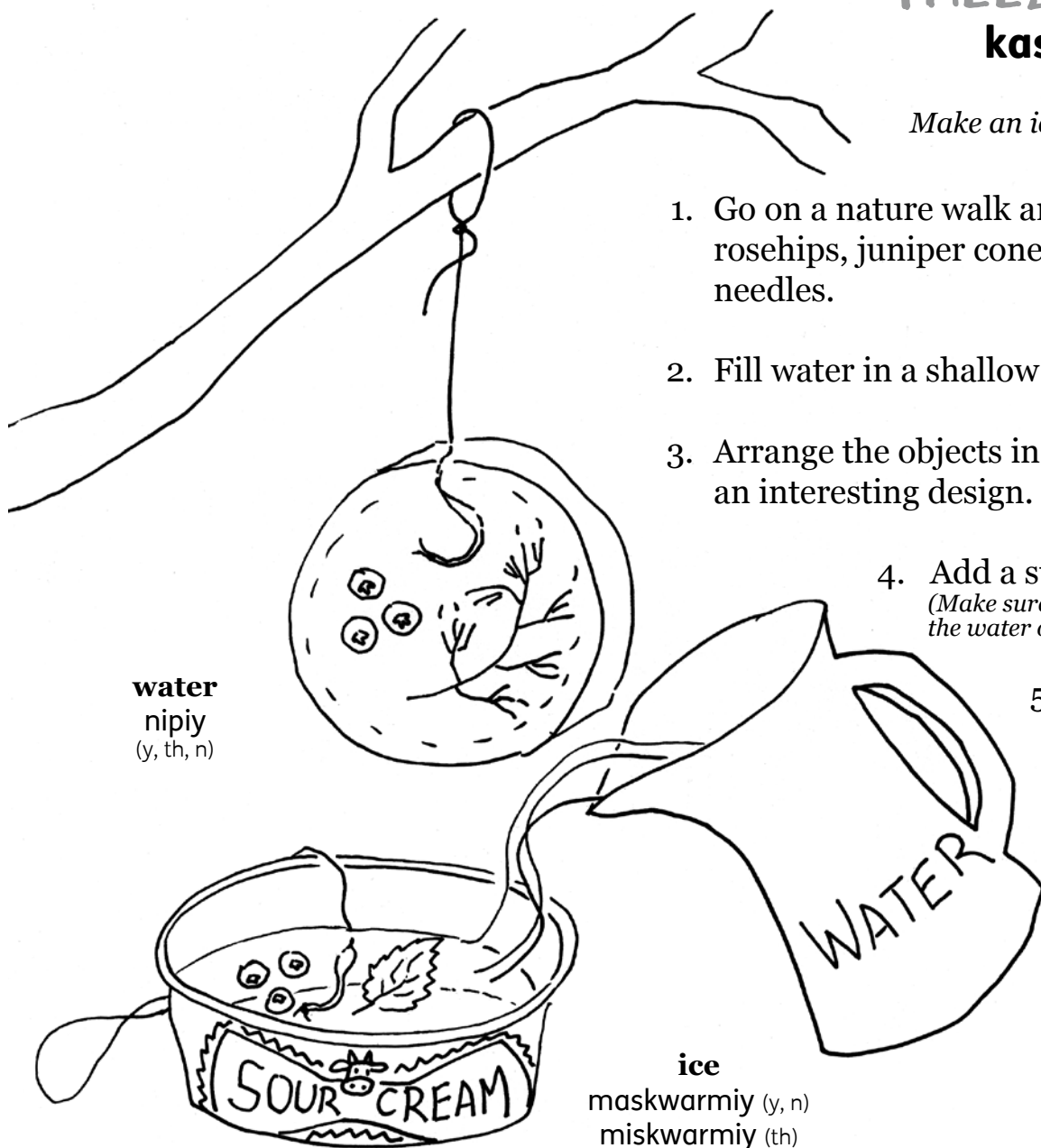

FREEZE-UP MOON

Make an ice ornament:

1. Go on a nature walk and collect dried rosehips, juniper cones, leaves or pine needles.
2. Fill water in a shallow plastic container.
3. Arrange the objects in the water to make an interesting design.
4. Add a string with a loop.
(Make sure there is lots of string in the water or it will pull out).
5. Take outside to freeze overnight.
6. Remove from the container and hang outside. *(You might need to dip the container in some warm water to remove the ice ornament.)*
